Newspaper report from 2006:

20th Annual Saskatchewan Cub Camp

The 20th Annual Saskatchewan Provincial Cub Camp was a wet but roaring success.

400 Scouts Canada members including Ventures, Scouts, Cubs, Service Scouters and Leaders participated in the Cub camp, which took place at the Moose Jaw Scout Camp June 9th to 11th.

There were volunteers and groups from Moose Jaw, Regina, Indian Head, Fort Quappelle, Ituna, Saskatoon, Prince Albert, Balgonie, Yorkton, Weyburn, Winnipeg, Craven, Pilot Butte, Melville, Esterhazy, Canora, Humbolt, Outlook and Assiniboia in attendance.

This year the program was based on a medieval theme.

The camp was kicked off Friday night with fireworks and a visit from the Lady of the Lake. The famous Excalibur was placed in the stone and the Cubs spent many spare hours throughout the weekend trying to pull the sword out.

Even though the activities were altered slightly to accommodate the weather the rain gear attired Cubs spent Saturday doing everything from making chain-mail key-chains, jousting with swimming noodles, trying to pull each other into the mud in tug-of-war and practicing archery to learning first aid, knife and axe, stove and lantern as well as water safety. They got to see how high they could stack and climb crates, did some canoeing, went whizzing down the zip-line and crossed the river on the boson's chair and rope bridge.

Hauling gear through water puddles, pulling a chariot through the mud or wearing mud splattered rain gear all weekend couldn't dampen the spirits of the participants. Wiener roasts, hot chocolate, tarps for shelter and dedicated leaders keeping everyone fed and dry put smiles on many faces.

A big birthday cake celebrating the 20th anniversary of the Cub Camp as well as the 60th birthday of the Moose Jaw Camp was served Saturday night.

Sunday morning the Moose Jaw Society of Creative Anachronism, Shire of Valley Wold and the Regina Society of Creative Anachronism, Shire of Seigalhundas from the Kingdom – Antir, Principality of Avacal treated the group to a demonstration. Everyone got into the act cheering for their favorite knight. The Cubs got to feel the weight of the helmets and armor - all of a sudden the rain gear didn't feel so heavy.

Everyone came prepared for wet weather and lots of fun. The bunkhouse was kept busy drying out clothes and Cubs alike but it never slowed anyone down. A security team consisting of Ventures and Scouts patrolled day and night to help ensure all was well. The Scout service team was there to lend a hand wherever needed. These dedicated young individuals helped keep up the morale of all the adults and youth.

Patches of blue sky were barely peeking through the rain clouds as everyone packed up to go home on Sunday but it didn't really matter because the memories of another successful Cub Camp will shine in everyone's hearts for years to come.
