NOTE 2: Due to the privacy act, we cannot ask for the health card number. Please leave that field blank.

NOTE 3: Each youth should carry a copy of their registration form on them (in their hat or in their shirt pocket, for example).

NOTE 4: Third Year youth are encouraged to bring their own PFD, if they own a good well-fitting PFD. (This will be for their own use only)

Rules and General Information

Scouts Canada Rules

1. There shall not be any alcohol or illegal substance on the camp premises. Evidence of the above will be grounds for immediate removal from the camp property.
2. Any form of prescription drugs are to be listed on the physical fitness or Scouts Canada registration form.

Common Sense Rules

1. For smokers: Do not smoke in plain sight of the youth. Cigarette butts should be kept in your pocket, not on the ground.
2. Quiet time is 23:30 hours to 6:30 hours (11:30 P.M. to 6:30 A.M.). If you are not in bed during these hours, please be quiet so others can sleep.
3. Outhouse / Toilet Courtesy: Anyone caught defacing or dirtying the toilet seats or the outhouses in anyway shall have to scrub down the mess and will be asked to leave camp. Pee and poop in the toilet, not on it. It will be the responsibility of the leader of that group to see that the guilty youth is taken home or picked up by the parent/legal guardian.
4. Permission to enter a campsite must be sought and obtained prior to entering another group's campsite.
5. Please refrain from swearing and be polite. This is part of a Registered Adult's Duty of Care. It is a standard that should also be upheld with Parent Helpers and youth.
6. 21st Century Rule: Practice Leave No Trace camping. Leave your site cleaner than it was when you arrived. Exception: Deadfall is fair game for fires, by permission of Camp Totowamihk staff.

Cub Camp Rules

1. Security will meet each group as they arrive and will provide instructions for signing in. Campers may start arriving at noon on Friday. Groups arriving after dark should please let the staff know ahead of time. Parents who drive their own children to camp cannot leave their youth unless the rest of the group or their Akela is already on the grounds.
2. At registration, each group will receive a package containing their hats, name tags, passport books, camp schedule and general information. An activity sign up sheet will be available at that time, so please talk with your adults to see how they would like to help.
3. All vehicles will remain in the parking lot. Be prepared to carry your gear into your campsite, so bring a wagon or garden trolley if you'll need one. Third-year Cubs and their leaders will be camping separately from the rest of their group, so ensure their equipment is packed separately.
4. Everyone must carry a copy of their Scouts Canada Registration Form or Physical Fitness form with them at all times, under their hat or in their shirt pocket. All Groups are responsible for keeping an up to date physical fitness or registration form at their campsite at all times.
5. All adults and youth must wear their hats and name tags at all times. Pin the nametag to the hat.
6. You must come self-contained. Tables, benches, chairs and tents are not supplied. Food is supplied for Third Year participants (youth and leaders) and Offer of Service only.
7. Camping is allowed in the treed area. Campsites are not assigned. Personal fires are allowed for those camping in the trees only. There is a lot of deadfall for firewood. For those camping on the grass, campfires are not allowed.
8. Leader tents and shelters must be clearly marked with fluorescent flagging tape. If there are any problems during the night, Security will seek help from the leader's tent. If the tent cannot be found, security personnel will have to wake a tent at a time until they find a leader tent.
9. There will be a leaders' meeting on Friday night. Security will be on patrol, so all leaders and parent helpers are able to attend this meeting. The rules, fire and safety precautions will be discussed and any unfilled positions will be assigned during this meeting. This meeting is also a chance for everyone to get acquainted and ask any further questions. Camp will supply the coffee and hot chocolate – you supply the mug.
10. The Saturday Night social will begin at 7:30 PM sharp. Camp Staff will judge the campsite decorations.
11. There will be a Formal Campfire on Saturday Evening. We will be marching in formation from the Flag Pole. Please have a positive song, skit and cheer prepared.
12. If someone has to leave camp temporarily, they must inform Security regarding where they are going and for how long they will be gone.

13. No one is allowed to leave camp until their campsite has been checked and cleared by camp staff.

14. Should a situation arise between a parent, a youth, or a leader, the camp staff will address the situation. If the camp staff deem it necessary, their Group Committee will then be contacted. There will be no camp disruptions.

General

- The Bunkhouse will be designated as the First Aid station. There will be qualified first aid on staff 24/7, thanks to St. John's First Aid. Cellphone coverage is inconsistent but works at the tops of hills. In case of emergency, dial 9-1-1 as you would normally. Please inform first aid and camp staff as quickly as possible.
 - We will have 3000 gallons of potable water arriving Friday evening. Please bring enough water for Friday Supper and Mug up. Thanks to Oasis on Wheels for the water and the truck.
 - A large Garbage Bin will be at the camp parking lot. All garbage for disposal must be bagged. Please burn paper garbage if you have a fire pit. Thanks to Waste Management for the delivery, pickup and use of the garbage bins.
 - When parking your vehicles please keep in mind that the main roadway must be kept clear in case of an emergency. Please make sure that any visitors coming out are aware of this.
 - Bring your group flags for ceremonies and to display at your campsites.
 - Third Year Cubs and Leaders will be provided with Mug up on Friday, Breakfast, Lunch, Snacks and Mug up on Saturday, Breakfast on Sunday. Saturday Supper and Sunday Lunch (if required) are to be taken with the rest of their group.
 - Scouts staying to help with their group's 1st/2nd-year cubs will eat with their group.
 - Scouts, Venturers and Adults listed as Offer-of-Service will report to the Offer-of-Service Coordinator on Friday Night for assignment.
 - Offer of Service meals provided are: Mug up on Friday; Breakfast, Lunch, Supper, Snacks and Mug up on Saturday; Breakfast and Lunch (if required) on Sunday.
 - There is no supervision or programming provided for siblings, out-of-age youth or unregistered youth attending this camp. Groups that bring such youth are responsible for ensuring that all an indemnity waivers and physical fitness form is included in their paperwork.
 - Vacant positions will be brought to the Camp Meeting on Friday Night to be filled.
 - The Moose Jaw Canoe Club will provide Catch Canoe services. Thanks to the Provincial Council for the use of their canoes.
 - There will be an informal campfire on Friday Evening.
 - The social will run start at 7:30 P.M. **You should target 200-250 items to give away.**
 - You may decorate your campsite at any time, but there will be time for decorating between 5:00 PM and 7:30 PM (You must also squeeze supper in there, though).
 - There is no programming between 5:00 PM and 7:30 PM, so if decorating your campsite and preparing for the social will not take that long, you may want to prepare another activity for your Cubs.
